Who can apply?

To qualify for admission you need to have:

- a law degree (J.D., LL.M or equivalent) that entitles you to practise law in your country of origin
- excellent academic results and references
- proven proficiency in English

Students are selected on the basis of their academic qualifications as well as work and other related experience.

What does it cost?

The Programme offers a limited number of scholarships, that take the form of partial tuition waivers. These waivers are awarded on the basis of a separate request, submitted as a part of your application. They are awarded upon an assessment of merit and demonstrable need.

What can you study?

After 8 mandatory courses (30 credits), students take one of the two specialisation options (12 credits) below, including practical exercises and a real life case study simulation. You close off the programme with a Master's thesis (18 credits).
